Dear Mr. Davidson:

I have completed my review of the Final Site Management Plan for Fiscal Year 2005, Naval Air Station Cecil Field, dated December 2004 (received December 30, 2004), prepared and submitted by Tetra Tech NUS, Inc. My comments on the Draft Site Management Plan for Fiscal Year 2005 were not addressed. Therefore, I cannot approve this document as final.

The specific comments not addressed concerned the Petroleum Program Schedules. Some of the entries in Appendix B, Petroleum Program Schedules, appear to be truncated. Several of the sites that are currently being remediated under either Natural Attenuation Monitoring Plan Approval Orders (NAMP AO), Remedial Action Plan Approval Orders (RAPAO) or Post-Active Remediation Monitoring Approval Orders (PARMAO) do not have entries showing future work. Other petroleum sites with further work required also appear to have their schedules truncated in late 2004 or early 2005.

Please note that petroleum program schedules are required by the October 23, 1990 Petroleum Contamination Agreement between the Department and the Navy. This Site Management Plan required by the Agreement to be developed by the Navy and submitted to the Department grants the Navy some flexibility with timetables, deadlines and schedules required to be met by Chapter 62-770, Florida Administrative Code, in assessing and remediating petroleum contaminated sites.

Please make the requested corrections to the Site Management Plan and resubmit. If you have any concerns regarding this letter, please contact me at (850)245-8997.
