Dear Mr. Ferro:

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has reviewed the Record of Decision (ROD) for Operable Unit (OU) 5, Site 15, Naval Air Station Cecil Field signed by the Navy on June 4, 2008 and signed by the Environmental Protection Agency on June 6, 2008. The Department concurs with the selected remedy as written in the ROD for Site 15. The selected remedy for Site 15 consists of excavation, on-site solidification/stabilization, off-site treatment and disposal of contaminated soil, and land use controls limiting use of the land to low-intensity recreational use. The Department concurs that this remedy should be protective of human health and the environment.

CERCLA Section 121 provides that remedial actions must satisfy any applicable or relevant and appropriate promulgated State requirement under State environmental law that is more stringent than any Federal requirement. Though the derivation of cleanup target levels for OU5, Site 15, preceded the enactment of Chapter 62-780, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), the requirements of that chapter and relevant portions of Chapter 62-777, F.A.C., have been satisfied by the remedy described in this ROD. Therefore, the provisions of Chapters 62-780 and 62-777, F.A.C., though applicable to OU5, Site 15, are not more stringent and need not be included in this ROD as applicable or relevant and appropriate requirements.
