Dear Major Shelley:

Soil processing at the NCBC is now complete. The last day of soil processing occurred on November 19, 1988. Results from the laboratories on the last bottom-of-the-hole sample analyses were received November 30, 1988. Per our telephone conversation on this date, decontamination of the soil excavation equipment and the soil feed system to the MWP 2000 is now proceeding as is some miscellaneous trash burning.

Soil processing records show that a total of 14,874.31 cubic yards (26,030.04 tons) of soil were processed in 244.73 operating days.

A similar written notification will be made when it is time to demobilize the MWP 2000.

EG&G Idaho has rechecked the characterization data for the NCBC storage area and has verified that every plot with a surface concentration of 1.0 ppb 2378 TCDD has been excavated to a depth where the 2378 TCDD, total TCDD, and total TCDF are each below 1 ppb. Ash sample results have been rechecked and verified as meeting the same criteria. Attachment I is a listing of the plots involved and the sample results.

EG&G Chemical Sciences has performed validation of sample results, reviewed the quality control data generated both in the laboratory and as

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a result of additional field samples and concludes the sample results contained in the data base accurately reflect the field conditions. See Attachment II.
