Following the regulatory meeting on 5 April 1993 that included representatives from the USEPA, a post regulatory meeting was held to discuss plans and schedules for the additional sampling to be done at Site A.

The main topic of discussion was to outline a schedule to meet the required monitor well installation and groundwater sampling. The proposed schedule is as follows:

	·	Field work - install and complete wells	45 days

	·	Data interpretation/reporting	30 days
***	·	Decision on delisting/second GWM sample set	60 days

Footnotes:

- * The work plan will be focused and streamlined as much as possible toward only the groundwater sampling (and ash sampling?).
- ** Dos Santos suggested having a meeting that includes all participants, including USEPA, at the draft stage of the work plan. MSDEQ individuals agreed to this idea.
- *** If contamination is found at the site, the decision will probably be to go forward with closure. This could potentially include spreading the ash, capping the site, and closing. This discussion included taking Sites B and C soils and adding them to Site A. Sites B and C could be closed as clean for soils although groundwater at B and C may still be contaminated. Jerry Banks (MSDEQ) made the statement that if the site(s) is dirty, sampling cannot stop. Per Jerry the base may be required to do a state RCRA permit recognizing SWMUs. The state will allow shortlisting of Appendix IX parameters (assumedly after an initial round of sampling for the full list).
