

Dear Captain Johnson:

The Florida Department of Environmental Protection concurs with the selected remedial alternative for Installation Restoration Site No. 7 (IR-7). The Decision Document specifies Groundwater Monitoring with Institutional Control as the selected remedial alternative. Specific land-use institutional controls applicable to IR-7 shall be part of the NAS Key West Land Use Control Implementation Plan (LUCIP).

The alternative referenced above has been selected as a cost effective remedy that provides adequate protection of public health and the environment. The determination to implement the selected remedial alternatives is consistent with the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA) as amended by the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act (SARA) and the National Contingency Plan (40 CFR 300). Accordingly, the above site shall undergo a five-year review with the costs of the review to be absorbed by the federal government.

We appreciate your continued cooperation and look forward to an expeditious environmental restoration of Naval Air Station Key West.
