I have reviewed the above document dated June 28, 1999 (received July 6, 1999). The document confirms that the criteria set forth in Chapter 62-770.680(2), Florida Administrative Code have been met. The Request is approved and a Conditional Site Rehabilitation Approval Order has been issued and is enclosed.
