Re: Soil Removed from Atlantic Marine Site

Dear Mr. Harris,

Please accept this transmittal as Atlantic Marine, Inc.'s (AMI) formal written response to questions concerning the removal of soil from the AMI facility, associated with a recently completed parking area paving project. The subject soil, approximately 30 cubic yards, was transported by the paving contractor, A & B Asphalt Repair, Inc., to an area adjacent to the Naval Station – Mayport air strip runway that is also currently receiving soil from the new Harbor Operations construction site. The soil was not transported to the new Harbor Operations construction site as previously reported. I accompanied the truck driver for A & B Asphalt, Mr. Roger Spencer, to the site where he deposited the soil, which was approximately 150 yards east of the back entrance gate onto State Road A1A. He further stated that as soon as the soil was deposited, a bulldozer compacted the area. If you would like to physically make a visible inspection of the site, I, or if you would prefer, Mr. Spencer, would be glad to accompany you to the site and show you where the soil was deposited.

Should you require any further information concerning this matter, or if I may perhaps be able to provide any additional assistance in bringing this matter to an expeditious resolution, please advise me accordingly. Thank you for your time and consideration.
