Dear Mr. Ugolini:

I have completed the review of the Source Removal Report (SRR) for Building 2510, Main Base, Naval Training Center, Orlando, dated September 2000 (received September 18, 2000), prepared and submitted by Tetra Tech NUS, Inc. Based upon the information in the report, I cannot concur that all petroleum impacted soil has been removed from this site. The text states that the excavation was limited to within 5 feet of Building 2036 while Figures 2-1 and 3-1 both show the excavated area as being up to the wall of Building 2036. Based upon where soil boring locations are shown on the two figures, there is still some doubt that all excessively contaminated soil was removed. Therefore, a revised Source Removal Report should be prepared. This revised report may be submitted as an appendix to a Site Assessment Report Addendum that reports on the assessment of current groundwater contaminant concentrations post soil removal.
