U. S. Navy Continues Extraction of Contaminated Groundwater at NASA Crows Landing Flight Facility

The Navy released an Action Memorandum describing time-critical removal actions for extraction of contaminated groundwater at NASA Crows Landing Flight Facility, California in November 2000 and a public notice announcing the availability of the Action Memorandum for review on 6 December 2000. The Action Memorandum was prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA). The Navy began extracting contaminated groundwater from existing wells at the Administration Area Plume in December 2000. A new extraction well was constructed and extraction of contaminated groundwater from the new well began in February 2001. The Navy has removed approximately 10 pounds of contaminant mass from the groundwater as of early March 2001. The Navy plans to continue groundwater extraction activities to remove contaminants until early summer 2001. The Navy invites the public to review and comment on the continued extraction activities. The Action Memorandum and other documents pertaining to the time-critical removal actions are available at the Stanislaus County Library, Patterson Branch on 46 North Salado, Patterson, California. The records for this action are available for review and comment at the library through 30 April 2001.
