DRAFT FINAL REMEDIAL INVESTIGATION/FEASIBILITY STUDIES (RI/FS) WORKPLAN, SAMPLING AND ANALYSIS PLAN (SAP), COMMUNITY RELATIONS PLAN (CRP), AND HEALTH AND SAFETY PLAN (HSP).

The Department of Health Services/Toxic Substances Control Program (Department) has reviewed the above mentioned workplans submitted by Marine Corps Air Station El Toro (MCAS El Toro) for review and comments as required by the Federal Facility Agreement (FFA). The Department feels that all the comments made to the draft version of the documents were adequately addressed in the draft final documents, and all the Department's concerns have been properly addressed.

Nevertheless, the Department has some comments on the Draft Final Community Relations Plan for Marine Corp Air Station, El Toro. Most of the changes we requested previously on the draft CRP have been incorporated in the final document. However, there are a few changes that DHS recommends on the final CRP as follows:

4.2.1 Fact Sheets, Page 4-13.

The CRP states that "a tear off coupon will be included on the first fact sheet". DHS recommends a mailing coupon be included in every fact sheet since the population is transient, and new members of the community may want to be included on the mailing list.

4.2.9 Mailing List, Page 4-17.

The first sentence in the last paragraph needs to be rewritten; it is instructional rather than factual.
