Subj: INSTALLATION RESTORATION (IR) PROGRAM

1. During the reference, the status of contractors to be used for the IR program at MCAS El Toro and Tustin was discussed. In summary, Mr. Sandza indicated that it appeared all IR work, including the Trichloroethylene (TCE) investigation, would be given to your CLEAN contractor.
2. We agree that most work under the IR program should be given to the CLEAN contractor. The only area we take exception to this is for the TCE investigation. James M. Montgomery, Consulting Engineers, Inc. has been working on the TCE investigation at MCAS El Toro for over four years. During those four years, Montgomery has helped us establish a very strong and credible relationship with the public in Orange County and with the various regulatory agencies. Montgomery has been involved with this problem from the very beginning, giving us much needed continuity in a very dynamic and complex area.
3. We request that James M. Montgomery continue with the TCE investigation at MCAS El Toro. It is our understanding that Montgomery's current contract has reached its limit but other avenues to use Montgomery are available.
