II. EXEMPTIONS

Please check the box below if exemption is appropriate, and proceed to the Certification section at the end of this Report if exempt.



The following facility is exempt from the Notification Requirement. This facility does not discharge any hazardous wastes to the Districts' sewerage system, i.e. the wastewater discharged from this facility is non-hazardous based on federal hazardous waste regulations under 40 CFR part 261. Only Federal regulations, and not California regulations, need be considered.

(Please note that if your wastewater discharge is hazardous based on any hazardous characteristics like toxicity characteristics shown in Table 1, or based on the presence of listed hazardous wastes, the entire wastewater stream including the water in it is hazardous waste. For this reason, the 15-kilogram exemption for hazardous wastes discharge during a calendar month allows for only a discharge of roughly 4 gallons of wastewater. Therefore, the exemption is practically unavailable if your wastewater is hazardous.)

(For reasons similar to the 15-kilogram exemption, the 100-kilogram exemption from Part B reporting is available only for a wastewater discharge of roughly 26 gallons per calendar month. Therefore, the 100-kilogram exemption is practically unavailable.)

III. NOTIFICATION OF THE DISCHARGE OF HAZARDOUS WASTES TO THE DISTRICTS' SEWERAGE SYSTEM

If your wastewater discharge is hazardous, a one-time notification is required. Please complete the attached hazardous waste information worksheet. If your facility has more than one industrial waste discharge permit, please list the discharges separately for each permit number, using copies of Table 2. Please complete Part B of the Hazardous Waste Information Worksheet to the extent that the information is known and readily available to you.

IV. DISCHARGE CERTIFICATION OF HAZARDOUS WASTE MINIMIZATION

You are required to certify that you have a hazardous waste minimization program in place at your facility. The Districts have an outreach program to assist you. Please use the enclosed Checklist for a Waste Minimization Program to evaluate your existing program for further improvement and return a copy with this Notification Report. Note that the California State Department of Health Services is also requiring certain generators of hazardous wastes to conduct an audit and prepare a plan for waste reduction by September 1, 1991 under the Hazardous Waste Reduction and Management Review Act of 1989.

V. CERTIFICATION STATEMENT

I certify, under the penalty of perjury, that I have personally examined, and am familiar with, all of the information in this Notification Report, including all attachments. Based upon my inquiry of those persons immediately responsible for obtaining the information contained in this report, I believe that the information is true, accurate, and complete.

If my facility is required to notify the Districts of the discharge of hazardous waste to the sewerage system, I further certify that this facility has a program in place to reduce the volume and toxicity of hazardous wastes generated, to the degree it has determined to be economically practical.
