
RESPONSE TO THE REQUEST FOR THE IDENTIFICATION OF POTENTIAL STATE APPLICABLE OR RELEVANT AND APPROPRIATE REQUIREMENTS (ARARs) FOR THE REMEDIAL INVESTIGATION/FEASIBILITY STUDY (RI/FS) FOR OPERABLE UNIT (OU)-1 AT MARINE CORPS AIR STATION, EL TORO

The Department of Toxic Substances Control (Department) received a request to provide potential state ARARs on February 21, 1995. The Navy was supplied with a list of potential state ARARs in March 1991 per the Navy's March 4, 1991 request. As part of the process and in accordance with §7.6 of the Federal Facilities Agreement (FFA), DTSC has re-contacted, in writing, state and local governmental agencies that are a potential source of ARARs. The responses have not been received as of the issuance of this letter. Upon their receipt the responses will be tabulated and forwarded to the Navy on or before April 10, 1995, as agreed to in our meeting of March 17, 1995 in San Francisco.

The Department disagrees with the stated Navy position that only ARARs for the "new" options be provided. As you are aware, the ARARs process is iterative.
