
Dear Mr. Gould:

The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) received the following documents for Site 1:

- Draft Work Plan, Ordnance and Explosives Range Evaluation, prepared by Earth Tech, Inc., dated March 2001 and received on March 30, 2001. The associated cover letter requested an expedited two-week review of the document and submittal of comments by April 13, 2001. The Work Plan details the objectives and procedures to conduct an ordnance and explosives (OE) Range Evaluation at Site 1.
- Unexploded Ordnance (UXO) Surface Sweep Work Package, prepared by Roy F. Weston, dated April 4, 2001 and received on April 10, 2001. The associated cover letter requested an expedited two-week review of the document and submittal of comments by April 25, 2001. The Work Package describes the objectives and procedures to accomplish a UXO surface sweep at Site 1 prior to commencement of the radiological survey.

DTSC understands the importance of these documents. However, these documents were not previously reviewed by DTSC. Further, due to the complexity of OE/UXO issues and associated regulatory requirements, DTSC will not be able to accommodate the requested expedited review. DTSC will review these documents concurrently and anticipates submission of comments on both documents by May 2, 2001.
