**FINAL ACTION MEMORANDUM NON-TIME -CRITICAL REMOVAL ACTION
APPROVAL: UNIT 2 OF SITE 19, AIRCRAFT EXPEDITIONARY REFUELING SITE,
MARINE CORPS AIR STATION (MCAS) EL TORO**

Dear Mr. Joyce:

On July 22, 1996, the Department of Toxic Substances Control approved the above subject document dated June 28, 1996, prepared by Bechtel National, Inc. The Action Memorandum documents the Department of the Navy's (DON) decision to undertake a Non-Time-Critical Removal Action for surface and subsurface soil contaminated with polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs) at Site 19 Unit 2. Since then, we received your September 25, 1996 revisions due to an incorrect statement regarding deed restriction when actually the requirement will be fulfilled through deed notification.
