## FINAL ACTION MEMORANDUM FOR TIME-CRITICAL REMOVAL ACTION AT PARCELS C AND D STEAM LINES, FUEL LINES, AND NON-VOLATILE ORGANIC COMPOUND SITES, HUNTERS POINT SHIPYARD, SAN FRANCISCO, CALIFORNIA

Dear Mr. Mach:

The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) has completed its review of the above-mentioned document. We do not agree with the Navy that the proposed response action meets the intent of a Time-Critical Removal Action (TCRA). It is DTSC's position that the actions proposed are interim measures and that final cleanup is subject to the Record of Decision approval process.


It is our understanding that the Navy intends to fully address all contaminations that may require remedial action in this proposed removal action. It should be noted that the cleanup criteria targeted for this removal action is protective of human health, with regard to specific exposure pathways considered in the risk assessments. Impacts to groundwater, drinking water aquifers, San Francisco Bay and ecological receptors will be addressed in revised Feasibility Studies for Parcels C and D, as appropriate. In addition, institutional controls will be evaluated in the Feasibility Studies and Proposed Plans.

It is also our understanding that the Navy intends to submit Field Sampling Plans, Quality Assurance Project Plans, Health and Safety Plans, and Construction Work Plans for our review and comment. DTSC is prepared to provide early inputs to the Navy upon receiving these documents but reserves its rights to evaluate all relevant data before approving Feasibility

Studies and Proposed Plans for Parcels C and D.
