

The following comments are in response to the request from Mr. Chein Kao of Department of Toxic Substances Control to review the draft document listed above.

General Comments:

1. This work plan is a good overview of what will take place during this step of the remediation but may not have enough detail if it is to be used for describing the procedures for sampling and analysis of the soil for release of the sites. It is not clear that a final status survey, including sampling will take place before the remediation areas are backfilled and resurfaced. DHS requests that the Navy specify that these areas are left open until after the Final Status Survey report has been reviewed and DHS concurs that the sites meet the criteria for unrestricted release.

Specific Comments:

1. Page 2, Section 3.0, j): The Navy should specify how they will determine that the sites meet the release criteria and when they plan to allow the areas to be refilled and resurfaced.
2. Page 6, Section 5.0, g) Soil Sampling 4): Please verify and clarify in the text that further remediation will be performed where soil samples exceed 150% of the established background.
