Hunter's Point Annex Information Release Environmental Clean-Up Process

The purpose of this Information Release is to notify interested parties in the community of the details concerning the Navy's ongoing environmental clean-up activities at Hunters Point Annex, as well as the transportation of hazardous waste from the Hunters Point Annex to disposal facilities.

Disposal of Hazardous Waste From Fence-to-Fence Survey

The Navy has recently completed a "fence-to-fence" survey of the Hunters Point Annex for surface debris and potential surface hazardous waste. During this survey abandoned hazardous materials and industrial wastes, e.g. lead-based paint, flammables, corrosives, poisons, waste oil including polychlorinated biphenyl (PCB) transformers, were found. Over the last month approximately 1,500 drums of these materials have been collected, tested, packaged and labeled and are now ready for disposal.

The Navy has contracted for the removal of these drums and transformers during the period of September 26, 1988 to December 31, 1988. Transportation of the materials to the storage/disposal facility will occur on weekdays during daylight hours. The route of travel from Hunters Point Annex (via Main Gate) to the storage facility will be via Evans Street in the Hunters Point community to Army street and onto Highway 101. The truck and operators will meet all applicable state and federal requirements for transporters of hazardous waste. All proper manifesting and labeling procedures will be followed as required by the State of California Department of Health Services.

PCB Oil Removed

As part of the Navy's ongoing program to remove electrical transformers containing PCBs, the Navy removed 35 drums of PCB oil on August 30 under a contract with General Electric, and 12 drums on August 31 under a contract with American Environmental.

Site History

Hunters Point Annex (formerly known as Hunters Point Naval Shipyard) was an active Naval Facility from 1941 until 1974 when it was placed in industrial reserve. In 1976, a major portion of the facility was leased to Triple A Machine Shop, which utilized the shipyard for commercial and Navy ship repair until late 1986. Currently, the Annex is under U.S. Navy administration.
