
This letter repeats my comment at the public hearing on November 20, 1990.

With respect to the current timetable for removing hazardous wastes from particular areas in the Hunters Point Shipyard (Shipyard) have to be revised because of the recent legislation contained in H.R. 4739. As you know, that legislation provides for the Navy leasing up to 260 acres of the Shipyards to San Francisco within the next year. I am assuming that the impact of this legislation was not contemplated when the current timetable for removal was prepared, and that San Francisco will only lease land from which toxic wastes have already been removed. If these two assumptions are correct, I am also assuming that your timetable for removing toxics for various areas at the shipyard will change in order to comply with the legislation.

I understand that the City may not be prepared to accept and begin efforts to use up to 260 acres by the end of the year, and that it won't want to lease land which it can not immediately begin using.

With the above in mind, I would very much appreciate a reply from the Navy concerning my comments, and how, if at all, the recent legislation will affect your plans to remove hazardous wastes from specific areas in the Shipyards.
