Specific Comments

1. Page 11, Section 2.2 "Site Characteristics", "Parcel C Ecology", 2nd Paragraph states that some of the storm drain and sanitary sewer lines in IR-06 and IR-25, explain in a few sentences how the drain and sewer lines are radiological impacted and what radionuclide of concerns were present?
2. Page 11, Section 2.3, "Parcel C Ecology, 2nd paragraph states that some of the storm drain and sanitary sewer lines in IR 6 and IR-25 were removed in 2007 and the remaining lines in Parcel C are scheduled to be removed during 2010 through 2012. For clarification, will all the storm drains and sanitary sewer lines in Parcel C will be removed?
3. Page 60, Section 2.9.2, "Description of Selected Remedy", last paragraph IC's states that "ICs will be implemented to prevent or minimize exposure to areas where potential unacceptable risk is posed by COC's in groundwater". If IC's are required radiological impacted areas for Parcel C may also require a license from the Radiological Health Branch.
