

DRAFT PROJECT WORK PLAN AND DRAFT HEALTH AND SAFETY PLAN, FOR SITE 4 REMOVAL ACTION AT THE NAVAL STATION LONG BEACH, LONG BEACH CALIFORNIA (FILE No. 90-76)

We have received and reviewed the Navy's *Draft Project Work Plan And Draft Health And Safety Plan, For Site 4 Removal Action At The Naval Station Long Beach, Long Beach California*, dated June 30, 1998. The work plan indicates that all soil stockpiled at Site 4 exceeding the screening criteria for this site will be segregated and transported off-site to a permitted treatment facility, oversized material and debris will be transported to an approved landfill, and the Site 4 W excavation will be backfilled with the remaining clean soil. Note that the material disposed of in a landfill must comply with waste discharge requirements (WDRs) issued by this Regional Board. You are authorized to proceed with the work plan, with the inclusion of the above referenced requirement. Please provide us with the final disposition of all soil transported off-site, and include a copy of the appropriate manifests.
