

## Amber Alert issued for a

PORTERVILLE, — An Amber Alert was issued Tuesday for an 8-month-old boy who authorities said was kidnapped with his mother from their Central Valley home by the boy's father.

Sebastian Mosqueda and his mother Monserrat Caracoza, 18, were abducted around 2 a.m. from Porterville by Pedro Mosqueda, 23, according to the Tulare County Sheriff's Office.

The boy's kidnapping prompted an Amber Alert in Kern, Tulare, Fresno and Kings counties, the California Highway Patrol said.

Mosqueda is suspected of taking the child after climbing through a

Tulare County sheriff's Lt. Keith Douglass said.

"The mother led the chase and ended up in the vehicle," Douglass said.

He said the woman's parents, who were staying at the house, heard yelling and called authorities.

A motive for the abduction has not been released.

Mosqueda was wanted on two warrants alleging domestic violence, Douglass said.

He was last seen driving a red, 1991 Honda Civic with California license plate number 5VOY539, according to authorities.

## Alameda votes on parcel tax to fund schools

ALAMEDA, — Alameda residents are voting on a new local property tax that school officials say is needed to avert teacher layoffs and campus closures on

the island city.

Measure A would tax each parcel at a rate of 32 cents per square foot of building space and raise about \$12 million annually.

The parcel tax needs to be approved by two-thirds of voters.



### NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY AND PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD MUNITIONS NON-TIME-CRITICAL REMOVAL ACTION PRODUCTION MANUFACTURING AREA AND SOUTH SHORE AREA FORMER MARE ISLAND NAVAL SHIPYARD, VALLEJO, CALIFORNIA

The Department of the Navy, in coordination with state and federal environmental regulatory agencies, is announcing the public availability of the Engineering Evaluation Cost Analysis (EECA)/Interim Remedial Action Plan (IRAP) for the Munitions Non-Time-Critical Removal Action at the Production Manufacturing Area (PMA) and South Shore Area (SSA) located on the Former Mare Island Naval Shipyard (MINS) in Vallejo, California. Former MINS is located 25 miles northeast of San Francisco. The PMA and SSA are located at the southern end of former MINS. The sites were formerly used to manufacture and store munitions and munitions constituents. Previous munitions removals have been conducted at the sites since base closure in 1996. Possible remaining munitions and munitions constituents at the sites may pose a threat to human health and the environment. Surveys have been performed to detect metallic objects in the subsurface, which could represent potential munitions. The areas where the survey identified subsurface metal are called anomalies. The EECA/IRAP recommends excavation and removal of the anomalies in the areas most likely to contain potential munitions.

#### PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

The EECA/IRAP is available for public review, and the Navy will accept comments during the 30-day public comment period held from March 7, 2011 through April 4, 2011. Public comments submitted in writing must be postmarked or e-mailed no later than April 4, 2011. 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
