Boy accused of killing 13-year-old

ROCKLIN — A teenage boy accused of killing a 13-year-old girl fled from their northern California home after her mother found the body in a bedroom and was caught after a short manhunt, police said Wednesday.

Authorities were trying to determine the relationship between the 14-year-old boy and the victim, Ashley Wood, who lives in the same house. Her mother discovered the girl dead Tuesday in the affluent bedroom community of Rocklin, about 25 miles northeast of Sacramento.

In brief**Santa Rosa considers urgent action on homelessness**

SANTA ROSA — The Northern California city of Santa Rosa may soon declare a state of emergency on homelessness.

The Santa Rosa Press Democrat reports Wednesday that the City Council asked staff members to return next week with three measures aimed at showing homelessness is the city's top priority.

The council also moved to expand a season program to year-round, allowing people to sleep in their cars on specific approved private properties during the winter months, the newspaper reported.

The council is also considering allowing the city to use its own buildings to create additional shelter for the homeless.

The move comes about three weeks after a 32-year-old homeless man was stabbed to death in a doorway where he often slept.

If a state of emergency is declared by the governor, it would need to be reinstated every 30 days for it to remain in effect.

County first in Bay Area to ban fracking

OAKLAND — The San Francisco Bay Area has its first countywide fracking ban.

The San Jose Mercury News reports that Alameda County supervisors in Oakland approved the ban late Tuesday by a 5-0 vote.

Fracking is when oil companies inject water or chemicals underground at high pressure to force oil out of rock.

Oil companies and environmentalists disagree over whether the process endangers underground water supplies, among other problems. Gov. Jerry Brown has resisted environmentalists' call for a statewide ban on fracking.

Oakland approves measures to control rent hikes

OAKLAND — The Oakland City Council has approved two proposals that would sharply limit property owners' ability to raise rents.

Oakland is the fourth most expensive rental market in the nation.

The San Francisco Chronicle reports Wednesday that the companion measures require landlords to petition for approval of any annual rent hike of more than 10 percent. Another measure will limit the amount that property owners can charge their tenants for capital improvements to a building.

Opponents of the rent control measures say they unfairly penalized small property owners. Others say capping rent hikes and extending eviction controls will benefit newcomers but hurt people whose families have lived there for generations.


