Dear Mr. McFadden:

On 22 July 1987, the Naval Air Station, Moffett Field, California, was included on the National Priorities List. As we have discussed, inclusion on the NPL triggered the requirement for NAS Moffett Field and the Environmental Protection Agency to enter into an interagency agreement for the completion of necessary remedial action for Moffett Field within 180 days after the EPA reviews the remedial investigation and feasibility study (which will be conducted) for Moffett Field.

Although the Navy and the EPA are not required to enter into an interagency agreement yet, the Navy believes that entering into an interagency agreement now (at an early stage of the Navy's response) would insure that the remedial investigation and feasibility study for Moffett Field are conducted in a manner satisfactory to the EPA. The Navy believes that, by conducting the RI/FS in a manner satisfactory to the EPA, agreement between the Navy and the EPA on the selection of remedial action can be facilitated and the implementation of remedial action expedited.

Accordingly, I request that legal and program representatives of the EPA meet with representatives of the Navy on 15 October 1987, at 2:00 p.m., as we have planned, to begin discussions about entering into an interagency agreement for NAS Moffett Field.
