

"I wouldn't really call that first one competing," Jeffery said. "I was happy to have just survived."

Sunday, Jeffery did more than survive: She finished seventh in her age group (45-49) and came in 411th overall in 2:36.18.

"I had a very fast swim and did a lot better than I thought I would," said Jeffery, who trains for one to two hours every day. "It was a fast course and I think everyone was pleased with their times."

Jeffery, who is 5-foot-4 and 119 pounds, said she used to be about 80 pounds overweight. Now, training and staying in shape is the focus for the tech-

nical editor, who also works as a personal trainer and coach.

"When I started triathlons I never expected to really be competing," Jeffery said. "I've discovered that I have a lot more physical ability than I ever expected. Most people do; they just don't have a chance to discover it."


Get Involved in Moffett Field


