# Undercover cop sheds disguise

OFFICER GETS HAIRCUT, RAISES MONEY FOR CHARITY AT CITY HALL GATHERING

happy to let the ponytail go. St. Clair donated his hair to support Locks of Love, which provides hair pieces to children suffering from long-term or permanent medical hair loss who cannot afford one themselves.

An officer from the Mountain View Police Department emerged from his undercover assignment last week, and in doing so shed a big part of his former image.

In front of nearly 50 other police officers, city government officials including council member Ronit Bryant, and friends, agent Frank St. Clair, formerly an undercover narcotics agent, got a free haircut.

All 14 inches of St. Clair's ponytail were ceremoniously chopped off to the applause of those at the event, held at City Hall's Rotunda last Thursday.

St. Clair, who has been with the department for 10 years, was recently promoted to a supervisory position within the department and therefore no longer needed the ponytail, said police representative Joanne Pasternack.

"Undercover agents need to fit in with the people they are trying to talk to," said Pasternack, who is also vice president of the Mountain View Police Activities League, or PAL, which helped to coordinate the event.

She added that St. Clair seemed

The police activities league held a raffle drawing to determine who would get to cut St. Clair's hair. Locks of Love specified St. Clair's hair be parted into eight individual sections, and so eight lucky winners stepped up to remove the last of his disguise. St. Clair also shaved the scruff from his neck, completing his clean-cut appearance.

Tickets to the event were \$5 apiece, and the event raised \$525, which will support the local PAL bicycle safety workshop for 20 at-risk youth in Mountain View, Pasternack said.


