



**Point Molate Restoration Advisory Board Adjournment**

The Department of the Navy (Navy) has partnered with environmental agencies and the community to coordinate the environmental restoration and cleanup of Point Molate under the Navy's Installation Restoration (IR) Program. The Point Molate Restoration Advisory Board (RAB) supported the IR Program and provided an open forum for the community to attend and participate in the IR Program at Point Molate.

In March 2010, the Navy completed the early transfer of the remaining 41 acres of the former Naval Fuel Depot Point Molate property to the City of Richmond. As a result of the early transfer to the City of Richmond, the Navy has relinquished control and environmental cleanup of the property. Pursuant to the Office of the Secretary of Defense policy contained within the Restoration Advisory Board Rule Handbook of March 2007, the Navy has concluded its support of the Point Molate RAB. The Navy and RAB community members formally adjourned the RAB at the April 7, 2010 RAB meeting.


