The U.S. Navy requests the public comment on a draft Engineering Evaluation/Cost Analysis (EE/CA) as part of a proposed non-time-critical removal action at Installation Restoration Program (IRP) Site 14, former Small Arms Range No. 2, at former Naval Training Center (NTC), San Diego. The purpose of the removal action is to reduce, to acceptable levels, the potential for ecological and human exposure to lead-contaminated soils at IRP Site 14, a former small-arms range.

The EE/CA identifies and evaluates six alternative actions to address lead-contaminated soil at IRP Site 14: excavation and off-site disposal of soil (with clean fill dirt brought in to replace the removed soil); on-site remediation (cleanup) of soil by use of electrical current; capping of soil in place; in-place soil solidification/stabilization; in-place soil vitrification (encasing of soil in a glass substance); and no action (leaving the lead-contaminated soil in place). The recommended alternative, based upon regulatory evaluation criteria (overall protectiveness of human health and the environment, compliance with applicable or relevant and appropriate requirements, short- and long-term effectiveness, implementability, and state and community acceptance), is Alternative 1: excavation and off-site disposal of contaminated soil, with clean fill dirt brought in to replace the excavated soil. The recommended alternative will achieve the removal action objectives, will not restrict future land use, will not require a long-term maintenance program, and will constitute the final remedial action for IRP Site 14.

IRP Site 14, the former Small Arms Range No. 2 (former Building 152), was constructed in 1942. The building contained shooting bays for small arms target practice. The facility operated as a small arms range from 1942 until 1993, and was demolished in 1994. Currently this site exists as a graded, landscaped lot. Analytical results from previous investigations indicated lead contamination in soils from spent ammunition at IRP Site 14.

The draft EE/CA is available for public review at the Point Loma Public Library at 2130 Point Loma Drive in Point Loma and the San Diego Public Library at 620 E. Street in downtown San Diego. For information on the operating hours of the libraries call 531-1539 (Point Loma) or 236-5800 (downtown). The public comment periods from October 6 to November 6, 1998. The recommended alternative, based upon regulatory evaluation criteria that protect aspects of human health and the environment, compliance with applicable or relevant and appropriate requirements, short-and long-term effectiveness, implementability, and state and community acceptance, is Alternative 1: excavation and off-site disposal of contaminated soil with clean fill dirt brought in to replace the excavated soil. The recommended alternative will achieve the removal action objectives, will not restrict future land use, will not require a long-term maintenance program, and will constitute the final remedial action for IRP Site 14.

IRP Site 14, the former Small Arms Range No. 2 (former Building 192), was constructed in 1942. The building contained shooting bays for small arms target practice. The facility operated as a small arms range from 1942 until 1993 and was demolished in 1994. Currently this site exists as a graded, landscaped lot. Analytical results from previous investigations indicated lead contamination in soils from spent ammunition at IRP Site 14.

The draft EE/CA is available for public review at the Point Loma Regional Library at 2130 Point Loma Drive in Point Loma and at the San Diego Public Library at 620 "E" Street in downtown San Diego. 
