**REVIEW OF SECOND ADDENDUM TO THE EXTENDED SITE INSPECTION  
WORK PLAN AT THE INACTIVE LANDFILL, NAVAL TRAINING CENTER,  
SAN DIEGO**

Dear Mr. Forman:

The Department of Toxic Substances Control, and the Regional Water Quality Control Board (hereinafter referred to as "State") have reviewed the second addendum to the extended site inspection work plan for the inactive landfill. It is the State's understanding that the Navy has discussed this proposed limited soil cover depth investigation with the State's Department of Fish and Game and the Federal Department of Fish and Wildlife. It is also the State's understanding that these agencies have agreed with the proposal.

Based on our review, the State agrees with the proposed hand augering protocol to evaluate the depth of the current soil cover. The State, however, would like to caution the Navy in the use of Photo-Ionization Detector (PID) and Flame-Ionization Detector (FID) for "Chemical Agent Monitoring" as stated in Section 10.1 of the Health and Safety Plan. Since both instruments have inherent limitations, a careful evaluation of the chemicals of concern and their ionization potentials should be conducted to ensure the effectiveness of these field screening instruments.
