MONTHLY STATUS REPORT
NAVAL STATION TREASURE ISLAND**

Reporting Period June 1993

I. PROGRESS MADE THIS REPORT PERIOD

Navy's contractor, PRC, continued to prepare the Draft Remedial Investigation (RI), Draft Human Health Baseline Risk Assessment (RA), and Draft Ecological Risk Assessment Report (EA).

Navy and Navy's contractor, PRC, coordinated the June 10, 1993 Open House and held the Open House as planned from 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Navy, DTSC, and RWQCB participated throughout the 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. period. Ms. Heidi Kritscher, PRC coordinated the Open House with Mr. Jim Sullivan, NAVSTA TI and Mr. Ernie Galang, EIC. Other project PRC participants at the Open House included Ms. Emily Pimentel, project manager, Mr. Randy Fish, toxicologist, and Ms. Christina Kabitzke, chemist. The concerns related to the nature and extent of contamination identified by the base residents were taken into consideration during preparation of the RI/FS reports. A concern regarding increased incidents of respiratory ailments will be specifically addressed by Mr. Sullivan. And a concern regarding whether Base residents can garden in the family housing area was addressed. The residents were informed that a report specifically looked at that concern and concluded that there is no reason to restrict gardening because potential contaminants do not pose a health risk for any of the exposure scenarios including gardening.

The Navy also reported its plans to install the extraction well at Site 14, in the last week of June. The specific date would be reported to DTSC and RWQCB. Navy also informed DTSC and RWQCB that they have issued a modification to PRC's contract to begin working on the work plan and cost estimate for the Phase II field investigations. However, the award was not expected to occur until Fall 1993.

2. MEETINGS AND REPORTS DURING THIS PROGRESS PERIOD

The TRC meeting and progress meeting was held June 21, 1993 at 1:00 p.m. The monthly meeting was held following the TRC meeting to provide the opportunity to discuss the contract deliverables and schedules issues that are typically discussed at the monthly meetings.

The TRC meeting representatives in attendance included Navy, DTSC, and RWQCB staff; in addition, citizen representatives included Mr. Don Angus, San Francisco Mayor's Office and Ms. Michelle Iverson, R.N., a NAVSTA TI Base resident. Mr. Sullivan and Mr. Galang provided general introductions, followed by an overview of the RI/FS process given by Ms. Pimentel. Mr. Fish narrated a slide presentation which helped describe the 22 sites where Phase I field investigations were conducted. Ms. Pimentel discussed the 9 sites where Phase II investigations will be conducted to address data gaps that were identified as a result of completing the Phase I field investigations. The Navy also reported on the success of the Open House and the types of concerns identified, and the opportunity for further public participation.

At the progress meeting, Navy, and RWQCB discussed the concerns identified at the Open House and the action that should be taken to respond to the concerns. Only two concerns were discussed as requiring action by the next monthly progress meeting, the other concerns could be handled in the preparation of the RI/FS reports. The two concerns requiring action included: (1) whether gardening was safe to practice in the family housing area and (2) increased incidents of respiratory ailments and whether they could be related to contamination at NAVSTA TI. PRC prepared a Preliminary Risk Assessment (RA) for the Family Housing Area. The RA concluded that the area does not pose unacceptable public health risks, and that included gardening as an exposure scenario. DTSC agreed to review the last correspondence on the

Final RA and respond with correspondence to the Navy regarding the acceptance of the Final RA. Subsequently, the Navy will prepare a statement on gardening and possibly have it printed in the Base newspaper, the MastHead.
