SUBJECT: DRINKING WATER WELL SAMPLING RESULTS NEAR
NAVAL AIR STATION PENSACOLA

Thank you for recently allowing the Navy to sample your drinking water well for specific per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS). I am writing to you today about the results of your property's drinking water that was sampled in Month 2025. PFAS were detected below the Department of Defense (DoD) PFAS Interim Action Levels for Private Drinking Water Wells levels in the sample collected from your drinking water well.

Enclosures 1 and 2 provide the validated results for your drinking water well sample, which was analyzed using the EPA drinking water test methods 533 and 537.1. PFAS were not detected at or above DoD's levels for PFAS in the sample collected from your drinking water well. No action is warranted by Navy at this time.

In April 2024, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) published nationwide PFAS drinking water standards that public drinking water systems must meet by April 26, 2029. These standards do not apply to private drinking water wells. The DoD, the parent agency of the Navy, issued a policy in September 2024 that takes into account these nationwide standards to address certain PFAS in private drinking water wells. This policy authorizes the Navy to implement enduring solutions to address private drinking water wells where certain PFAS are at or above the DoD PFAS Interim Action Levels for Private Drinking Water Wells established in the policy. These levels are provided in Enclosure 1.
