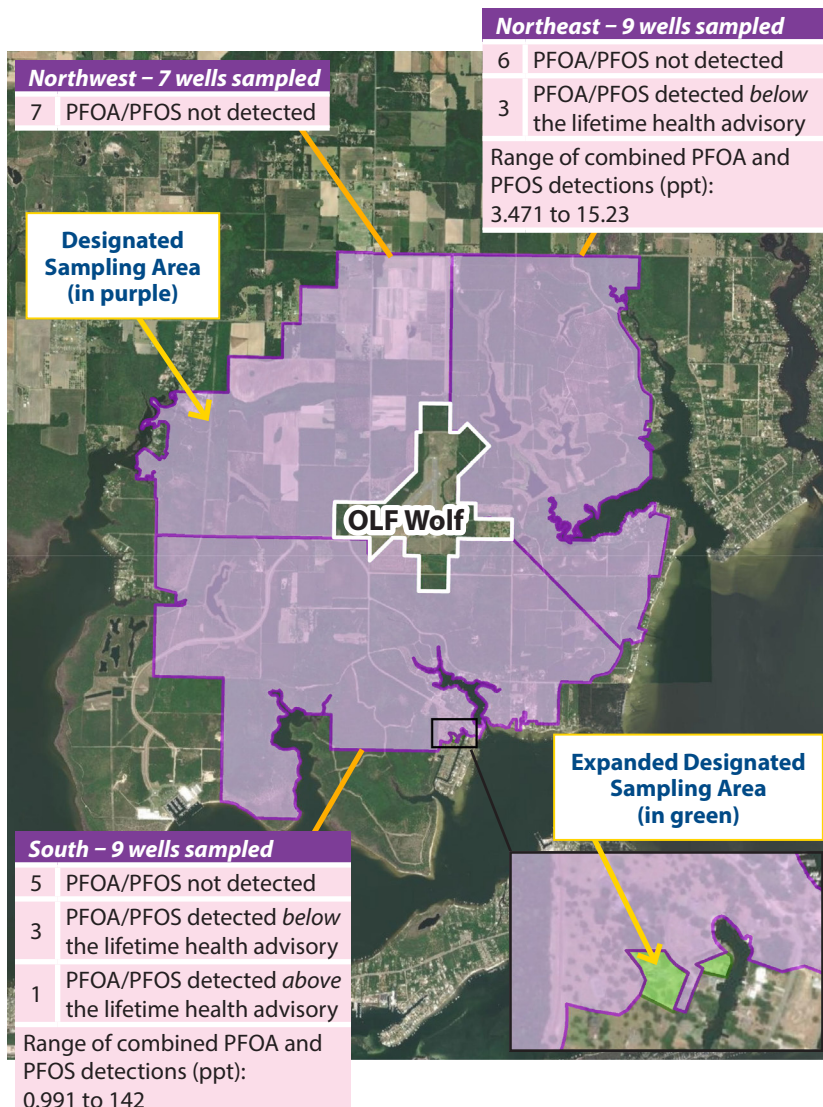




Drinking Water Investigation near Outlying Landing Field Wolf

The Navy began a drinking water well investigation near Outlying Landing Field (OLF) Wolf, an OLF for Naval Air Station (NAS) Whiting Field, in June 2021. The Navy tested for certain per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS), specifically perfluorooctane sulfonate (PFOS) and perfluorooctanoic acid (PFOA), which may be present in these drinking water wells due to past uses on-base of aqueous film-forming foam (AFFF), or other PFAS-containing materials.

The property with a detection of PFOA above the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency lifetime health advisory of 70 parts per trillion (ppt) has been provided bottled water, and the Navy will continue to provide bottled water until a long-term solution is implemented. This property is located to the south of OLF Wolf.



Based on the results, the Navy is expanding the drinking water investigation to the south of OLF Wolf in the direction of groundwater flow. The sampling area to the northwest and northeast of OLF Wolf will not be expanded based on the results to date.

Our records indicate that you are a resident and/or property owner in the sampling area.
