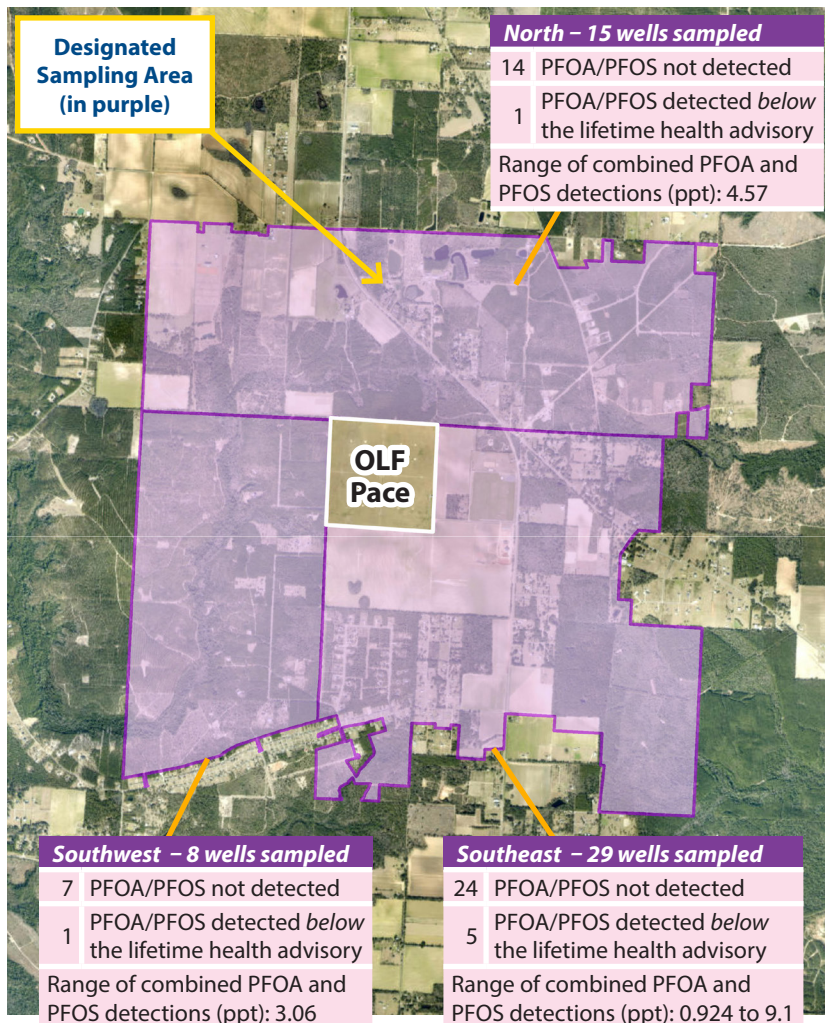




Drinking Water Investigation near Outlying Landing Field Pace

The Navy began a drinking water well investigation near Outlying Landing Field (OLF) Pace, an OLF for Naval Air Station (NAS) Whiting Field, in June 2021. The Navy tested for certain per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS), specifically perfluorooctane sulfonate (PFOS) and perfluorooctanoic acid (PFOA), which may be present in these drinking water wells due to past uses on-base of aqueous film-forming foam (AFFF), or other PFAS-containing materials.



PFOA and PFOS were not detected above the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency lifetime health advisory of 70 parts per trillion (ppt) in any of the wells sampled.

Our records indicate that you are a resident and/or property owner in the sampling area and your drinking water well has been tested.
