Vieques Site Management Plan

NAVFAC Atlantic announces that the Fiscal Year 2011 Draft Final Site Management Plan (SMP) for Vieques is available at the locations below for public review from December 10, 2010 through January 10, 2011.

The SMP is updated every year and is used to plan, schedule, and set priorities for environmental and munitions response actions. It describes all currently identified CERCLA sites at former Naval facilities on Vieques and the schedules that the Navy and the regulatory agencies have agreed to.



Recently, a few munitions-related items, removed in the past from the former range, have been found in the community. Someone might have thought an item would make a souvenir, but their action could have endangered the safety of many. All munitions items, whether small or large, shiny or rusty, can be dangerous – don't touch!

We maintain a strict control over all items found during the munitions cleanup following explosive safety regulations to ensure that all items are disposed of properly.

If you find a suspicious item on public or private property, please report it to the Police (787-741-2020). The Police will contact their explosives experts and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) to handle the situation. No one who is not properly trained and authorized shall move these items.
