
Kids learning how important is to have only trained personnel working on the munitions removal operations.

Fishermen and Boaters: For your safety, keep away from the east area of Vieques

It is always considered dangerous to anchor or beach within the marked area. Vessels are cautioned not to enter this area.



Boaters should consult the U.S Coast Guard Navigation Center's website at <http://www.navcen.uscg.gov/lmn/default.htm> for Local Notices to the Mariners posted for waters around Vieques (District 7).

Results of ongoing MEC (Munitions and Explosives of Concern) investigations by the Navy and the proposed land use plan of the Department of Interior will be used to determine which areas will be permitted for public use in the future.

Warning buoys have been installed to alert the public of the dangers of MEC potentially present in the water.

To keep Vieques residents and visitors out of the most dangerous areas, roads have been barricaded and warning signs have been posted.
