

**NOTICE OF EXTENSION OF PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD
CERCLA TIME-CRITICAL REMOVAL ACTION
BUILDINGS 2 AND 27 LOCATED ON WARREN G. MAGNUSON PARK SEATTLE,
FORMER NAVAL STATION PUGET SOUND (NSPS)**

The U.S. Navy is extending the Public Comment Period for the low-level radiological Time-Critical Removal Action at Warren G. Magnuson Park from June 27, 2013 to July 25, 2013.

Acquired by the Navy in 1920, former Naval Station Puget Sound, now known as Warren G. Magnuson Park, was originally a Naval Air Station where aircraft repair and maintenance was performed. The Naval Air Station used radioluminescent (glow-in-the-dark) paint to repair and touch up dials, markers, and gauges for aircraft, in buildings 2 and 27. In coordination with state environmental regulatory agencies, the U.S. Navy is performing a Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA) Time-Critical Removal Action to remove building materials, structures and areas with low-level radiological contamination related to these painting activities to reduce potential risk to the public and the environment. The Action Memorandum recommends removal of radiologically contaminated materials and disposal in regulated landfills. There is currently no public access to contaminated areas.
