



OICC MCIWEST Officer in Charge of Construction Marine Corps Installations West



NAVFAC Southwest held a Change of Command Ceremony for the Officer In Charge of Construction (OICC) Marine Corps Installations WEST (MCIWEST) at Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton.

Camp Pendleton, CA – A Change of Command ceremony for OICC MCIWEST was held Aug 17. Captain Michael D. Williamson was relieved by Captain Marko Medved as the Commanding Officer OICC MCIWEST.

OICC MCIWEST leads the field execution of projects at six Resident Officer in Charge of Construction (ROICC) offices located at Marine Corps installations in Camp Pendleton, Twentynine Palms, Miramar, Yuma, Barstow, and Bridgeport. Total work completed to date has injected over \$4.3 billion into local economies, and the program is looking to award another 2.5 billion in additional work. Key programs benefiting the Marine Corps' readiness and quality of life include 46 Bachelor Enlisted Quarters valued at \$1.4 billion, hangars and basewide improvements for the F-35B Joint Strike Fighter valued at \$414M, airfield improvements on MCAS Miramar and MCAS Camp Pendleton for the MV-22 Osprey valued at \$161M, the 29 Palms North Mainside Expansion valued at \$408M providing infrastructure and organizational facilities for over 1100 Marines, and the new Camp Pendleton Replacement Hospital project, valued at \$563M. The six ROICC offices reporting to OICC MCIWEST have grown from 120 collective personnel to over 285 in support of the increased workload.

OICC MCIWEST's commitment to safety is second to none. Since its establishment in August 2008, OICC MCIWEST has completed a remarkable 19.4 million man-hours of construction with a Days Away, Restricted, and Transferred (DART) rate of 0.42 which is five times less than the industry standard.

OICC MCIWEST is committed to delivering World Class facilities solutions to the Marine Corps' largest construction program since World War II.
