






Nothing that we do is worth the risk to the life or health of any member of the command. We will emphasize safety in our training, in our planning, and in our daily work. Before beginning work, we will evaluate our planned actions through the use of Operational Risk Management (ORM). If circumstances change during execution, we will stop and reevaluate, adjust our procedures and safety measures, then proceed. Immediate correction of recognized hazards will be our standard. Regardless of rank or position, you will take immediate action to correct any unsafe condition demonstrated by the command or our contractors.

Key Initiative 4

Supervisor Safety Responsibilities

One of the most basic responsibilities of a supervisor is to ensure employees perform their tasks safely and are provided with the tools and training to do so. In concert with Workforce Development, we will implement a supervisor safety training module, promulgate supervisor safety responsibilities and accountability standards to new employees during indoctrination and to supervisors via leadership training.



Key Initiative 1

OSHA Voluntary Protection Program

The Voluntary Protection Program (VPP) recognizes employers and workers in the private industry and federal agencies who have implemented effective safety and health management systems. To achieve VPP status, NAVFAC Southwest leadership, labor, and OSHA will work cooperatively and proactively to prevent fatalities, injuries, and illnesses through a system focused on: (1) hazard prevention and control; (2) worksite analysis; (3) training; and (4) management commitment and worker involvement. NAVFAC Southwest has finished its Stage 1, 2 and 3 Assessments of the VPP process.

In 2019, the command will complete the application process for at least two sites, and complete internal audits of the other sites to assess readiness and prepare them for certification.



Key Initiative 2

Fall Protection Survey and Identification of Safe Working Procedures

NAVFAC Southwest provides service to a number of facilities that require fall protection. Those facilities need to be surveyed based on the work that our workers do and fall analysis, avoidance, mitigation and protection need to be identified and procured to prevent mishaps. We will conduct those surveys, identify fall hazards associated with NAVFAC Southwest work, identify safe procedures to access heights when required, and procure all fall protection equipment needed.

Those audits will provide guidance on how well we comply with our own policy, identify problems and implement solutions to ensure a safe working environment and compliance with our doctrine.
