Navy Waterline Near Aiea Elementary School Under Investigation

PEARL HARBOR-HICKAM, Hawaii – Naval Facilities Engineering Command (NAVFAC) Hawaii waterline crew responded this morning to the report of a waterline break near Kaimakani Street in front of Aiea Elementary School and its entrance to the school parking lot.

The Navy does not provide water to the school, the Board of Water Supply is their water source. However, the Navy owns a 24” waterline that runs from its Halawa Pump Station under Kaimakani Street.

At this time, the waterline crews are working to shut down the line and investigate if the break is in the 24” pipe or a lateral line leading off of it. Another possibility is a faulty valve. All will be examined.

The Navy apologizes for any inconvenience to school personnel and parents as well as residents in the area. It is unknown currently how long a repair may take until the source of the problem is determined.
