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**NAVFAC Pacific Awards Japan-Funded Design Task Order for
Guam Realignment Work**

PEARL HARBOR – Naval Facilities Engineering Command (NAVFAC) Pacific awarded a \$3.36 million design task order to AHL Setiadi Gushiken Joint Venture LLC of Honolulu, April 17 for architecture and engineering work required for utilities and site improvements of North Ramp on Andersen Air Force Base (AAFB), Guam.

"The Department of Defense (DoD) is committed to establishing a Marine Corps presence on Guam," said Joe Ludovici, (acting) principal deputy Assistant Secretary of the Navy for Energy, Installations and Environment. "This award reflects Japan's willingness to contribute to the accomplishment of this objective."

This project will provide design of utilities infrastructure consisting of electrical, water, wastewater, communications, roads, parking, security fencing, site improvements, and earthwork in support of North Ramp construction at AAFB. Design of structures include, but are not limited to, electrical substation, fire pump hose, sewer lift station, and water storage tank.

"Design work is a crucial component to the overall project at North Ramp," said Cmdr. Keith Barton, NAVFAC Pacific Guam Program Management Office (PMO). "It will enable required infrastructure to be in place for future development to support Marine aviation."

This task order was awarded against a \$50 million maximum, firm-fixed price, indefinite delivery, indefinite quantity (IDIQ) contract awarded in January 2010 in support of the Defense Policy Review Initiative (DPRI) in the NAVFAC Pacific area of responsibility.

DPRI Government of Japan funded projects (otherwise referred to as Mamizu funds) will involve new construction, repair and alteration of base development facilities.
