- Colors

- Dark Blue – Represents the Traditional Navy
- Light blue – Represents a more modern contemporary perspective
- Gold – Represents both Navy and Marine Corps gold

- Abstract Representations

- The arch sweeping arch in NAVFAC has two representations
 - The curved edge of a globe representing NAVFAC as a global organization
 - An ocean wave representing our service to the Navy
- The sweeping lines subtly represented in the background of the square represents three concepts
 - The hull of ship
 - The lines of a wake breaking behind a ship
 - A design drawing
- The golden crosshairs in the foreground of the square represent two concepts
 - Design crosshairs representing a simple design tool that is both traditional (paper drafting) and modern (CAD)
 - Crosshairs of a weapons system which can represent support of the Navy/Marine Corps Combat Team
- The blue square itself also represents a couple of alternatives
 - The ocean underlying the “ship” or “wake” described above
 - The foundation of a facility – strong square cornerstone
