Ryan, 34, of Massapequa, was pinned under the Pathfinder, and was extricated by East Farmingdale Fire Department. She was transported via Suffolk County Police helicopter to Stony Brook University Hospital where she is hospitalized in serious condition with multiple fractures.

The other patron, Marianne Turndahl, 37, of Rockville Centre, was transported to Good Samaritan Hospital Medical Center in West Islip in stable condition.

"Our hopes, thoughts and prayers are with those injured in this accident. The safety and well-being of our Panera Bread guests and staff is our top priority. Members of our team are working closely with local authorities to gather details. We also appreciate the response from local first responders on the scene," said Gregory K. George, vice president of Doherty Enterprises, Inc., Panera Bread Franchisee on Long Island.

Reed Cubinski, manager of the Chipotle nearby, said, "I'm very upset this happened. Panera Bread is our neighbor, and I'm friends with employees there. I want to help out as much as I can. My heart goes out to those injured."

An employee at the Chili's restaurant nearby said he went outside for a smoke break and witnessed the scene.

"It was crazy. The whole side of Panera

Bread was all banged up and there was glass all over the place," he said. "I went to get a better look because there were a lot of police and people around. There was a lot of commotion. When I looked closer I saw an SUV inside the restaurant with yellow police tape around it. It was an unbelievable sight. Surreal. I just hoped nobody had been killed or badly hurt."

Mike Leone, a familiar customer to the Farmingdale Panera Bread went to inspect the aftermath of the scene the day after the accident. He said, "I just came to look at the scene because I had heard what happened on the news. It's crazy because I come here all the time for breakfast and I always sit near where the car crashed through the window. I just hope the women who got hurt by the vehicle will be okay."

projects and upgrades to district facilities. The proposed capital fund would operate with an established maximum limit and would be used to revisit the district's capital-improvement needs, including roof replacements district wide, a comprehensive public school safety program and other related needs identified by the district's Facilities Advisory Committee. The reserve fund would require voter approval, and is included in the proposed budget as "Proposition #2." The reserve would not require an increase to the tax levy.

In addition, as part of the district's ongoing Energy Performance Contract, Farmingdale announced that 26 classrooms at Saltzman East Memorial Elementary School were renovated with new ceilings, lights and occupancy sensors since last year. The district anticipates these upgraded amenities to be implemented in the remaining district buildings during the summer of 2015. All of these projects come at no additional cost to taxpayers.

The district also announced several district-wide and building-specific projects to enhance safety for students and staff throughout the district. These upgrades include installing new security cameras at all district buildings, replacing the playground surface at Albany Avenue Elementary School and installing new sidewalk portions and walkways at Howitt Middle School and Northside Elementary School.
