The following text is added to the bullet items under Section 4 Site Visit and Investigation:

- The garage bay (Room 124 - Garage/Storage), located on the southeast side of the building, was reportedly used to receive deliveries and for storage of office supplies and equipment. The only items present during the site visit were two copier machines and a table. In the past, it was reportedly used to store hazardous materials in flammable cabinets. (A small concrete-block building, located in the parking lot south of Building 151 was also used for hazardous materials storage.) No hazardous waste was generated at Building 151, with the exception of universal waste (fluorescent bulbs), according to NAS Brunswick personnel. The room is equipped with an overhead door, therefore it may have been also used to store vehicles.
- Available information indicates that routine medical exams were conducted in second-floor medical/lab area including the drawing of blood samples, and that no patient treatment or more extensive testing procedures, such as medical x-ray, were conducted at the facility.
