Dear Mr. Wilkie:

On behalf of the Navy, please find two enclosed copies of the subject documents. These documents present PCB soil test results and a work plan for supplemental soil sampling to be conducted at a former transformer concrete slab at Site 10B – Engine Test House. The transformer was removed by Northrop Grumman in the late 1990's. In early 2009, a small metal tag was observed near the remaining concrete slab that indicated the presence of a PCB Transformer. In July 2009, the Navy collected samples of the concrete slab and surrounding soil. PCBs were detected in the concrete at a concentration up to 200 µg/kg and in surrounding surface soil at concentration of 990 to 11,000 µg/kg.

This letter serves as notice of the detection of PCBs in soils and of the Navy's plan to further delineate the extent of the PCBs in the soils. The Navy would like to proceed with this investigation in a timely manner and potentially coordinate removal of these contaminated concrete and soils with a similar removal of a former transformer concrete slab and PCB-contaminated soils at Site 6A later this year or early 2010.
