MEMORANDUM

**FOR THE MEMBERS OF THE RESTORATION ADVISORY BOARD (RAB) FOR THE INSTALLATION RESTORATION PROGRAM AT NAVAL WEAPONS INDUSTRIAL RESERVE PLANT (NWIRP) CALVERTON, NEW YORK**

Enclosed is the Navy's Final Phase 2 Remedial Investigation /RCRA Facility Investigation (RI/RFI) Report for Installation Restoration (IR) Site 2 - Fire Training Area located at NWIRP Calverton, New York.

Information regarding this site was previously forwarded to Calverton's former Technical Review Committee (TRC) for review in a report dated January 19, 1998. Based upon comments received by the regulatory community as well as Calverton's Restoration Advisory Board (RAB), the Navy reformatted the environmental presentation using a GIS-based profiling program. This new data evaluation and presentation were the focus of a technical subcommittee meeting held on February 16, 2000, where it was determined that the nature and extent of contamination at this site was adequately characterized to allow the Navy to proceed to a Feasibility Study/Corrective Measures Study (FS/CMS) for Site 2. The data was also presented at a RAB meeting held on February 16, 2000.

Efforts to prepare the FS/CMS for Site 2 will commence in the same manner as with Site 7. That is, the Navy will soon be conducting a sampling program at Site 2 to determine if Monitored Natural Attenuation (MNA) is a viable technology for final remediation of contaminated groundwater or if it needs to be combined with another active remedial technology. Documents forwarding the Navy's workplan for this effort will be forwarded for review under separate correspondence.
