
Enclosed please find two (2) copies of the above-referenced report for your review. Copies of this report have been forwarded to Mr. George Radford (EMD, Camp Lejeune). Upon receipt of your comments on or before April 27, 1992, Baker will prepare a draft report.

The preliminary operable unit prioritization has grouped the 17 current RI/FS sites into ten potential operable units. Baker accomplished this task by considering four options for prioritizing the sites: 1) geography (relative locations of the sites); 2) materials disposed and contaminants detected at the sites; 3) separate operable unit for each site; and, 4) sites in common drainage areas. Potential groups of operable units were listed based on these four options. Then a recommendation of the ten potential operable units was made based on criteria that take into account the similarities of some of the sites, and the unique characteristics of other sites.
