Dear Mr. Townson:

The Superfund Section of the Division of Waste Management has received the March 31, 2014 letter from Camp Lejeune, which stated that a portion of the MMRP Site UXO-26, Former B-3 Gas Chamber Area has been approved by Marine Corps Installations Command to be re-opened for operational training use and will, therefore, be removed from the MMRP.

To summarize for the records, the former B-3 Gas Chamber MMRP site included 3 areas designated as ASR #2.79a, ASR #2.79b, and ASR #2.79c. From the work that has already been completed, there were no risks identified for any of the three areas for munitions constituents in soil or groundwater. Additionally, areas ASR #2.79a and ASR #2.79c were determined to need no further investigation for the presence of munitions. The remaining investigation was only to be conducted in area ASR #2.79b for munitions potentially presenting an explosive hazard (MPPEH). As stated in the March 31, 2014 letter, the Base has completed surface and subsurface clearance activities for potential UXO prior to its return to use for active training.

Our records will be updated to reflect the removal of this site from Camp Lejeune's MMRP program.
