Dear Mr. Stevens:

The North Carolina Superfund Section has completed its review of this document and concurs with the decision to close out OU 7, Sites 1 and 28. With the exception of oscillating lead levels at one Site 28 monitoring well, four consecutive rounds of groundwater monitoring data show levels below the remediation goals set by the October 1996 Record of Decision. The oscillating lead levels are thought to be at least partially caused by natural groundwater conditions and may continue indefinitely. However, due to these conditions, the groundwater and intrusive activity restrictions that are contained in the Land Use Control Implementation Plan for OU7 should remain in place.

No additional investigation or remediation will be required unless the Superfund Section later determines, based on new information or information not previously provided to the Section, that the site is contaminated above current standards or that the Section was provided with false or incomplete information.
