## East Carteret brings 'Beast' to Down East

What has 80 high school students, 16 elementary school students and four gargoyles?

East Carteret High School's production of "Disney's Beauty and the Beast," opening March 5, and playing March 6-7 and 13-14.

The shows begin at 7 p.m. with an additional matinee show on March 7 and 14 at 1 p.m. Tickets are \$6 for students, \$8 for general seating and \$12 for reserved seating.

A kids' brunch before the two matinees will be available for an additional \$5. Children eat with the cast of the show at 11 a.m.

"Disney's Beauty and the Beast" is the Broadway adaptation of the Disney movie "Beauty and the Beast." Additional musical numbers have been added to the show.

"Like the Disney movie, which inspired it, this musical

tells the story of a young girl who's not quite like all the rest and a young prince too quickly influenced by outer beauty," East Carteret teacher Jennifer Green said. Ms. Green is the director of the musical and head of the school's drama department.

"It also tells the story of friendship, love and hope. From the tender relationship between Belle and her father, to the comic banter of Cogsworth and Lumiere, and the turbulently heart-wrenching love between Belle and the Beast. This story is about humanity. It's a timeless story. We prefer to do children's stories, something that will appeal to a large audience."

Annually, East Carteret produces a large play. Last year, the students performed "Thoroughly Modern Millie."

This year, high school senior Jamie Minchin will direct the play with Ms. Green.

"Her innate talents and her ability to inspire the cast and

crew have resulted in much of what you will see onstage," Ms. Green said.

East Carteret music teacher Kelly Champobasso will direct the play's music.

The school's annual musicals incorporate an acting cast, technical crew and the music department — and this year it will include 16 elementary school students playing the provincial town's sheep and children, and some of the castle's enchanted objects.

A large technical aspect of the play this year is the makeup. High school makeup artists must transform students into four gargoyles and four wolves.

"I have a whole team of makeup artists," Ms. Green said. "Lots of opportunities for our tech crew to shine."

The technical crew also constructed two 1,600-pound interchangeable sets for the play.



## Public Notice

### Aerial Digital Geophysical Mapping in Bogue Sound

**What:** The U.S. Naval Facilities Engineering Command Mid-Atlantic (NAVFAC) will conduct aerial digital geophysical mapping (DGM) in Bogue Sound, for approximately 15 days beginning the first week of March 2009. Operations will take place during daylight hours only, 7 days per week.

A commercial helicopter operated by National Helicopters/Battelle (NAVFAC contractors) will fly back-and-forth passes at a flight altitude of 4 to 5 feet above the water surface, in an area between Gales Creek, Salter Path, Archer Point and Humphreys Point. Each day, the helicopter will fly over several rectangular survey blocks, typically about 1/2 mile by 1/4 mile in size, within this 10-square-mile investigation area.

This operation is called aerial Digital Geophysical Mapping (DGM) and will be used to detect possible old munitions that may remain on or near Wood Island, from aerial bombing training in the past. The site has not been used as a target since about 1955 and there are no plans to reactivate it.

**When:** March 2009, 7 days per week, during daylight hours. The effort will last about 15 days. This is an approximate schedule that may change due to weather conditions, equipment performance, and other factors.

**Where:** The investigation area is bounded by coordinates 34° 41' 13"N 77° 0' 30"W to 34° 40' 23"N 77° 0' 12"W to 34° 41' 23"N 76° 53' 57"W to 34° 42' 59"N 76° 54' 46"W, or generally between Gales Creek, Salter Path, Humphreys Point, and Archer Point.

**Boating Safety:** Boaters are urged to remain clear of the survey blocks within the investigation area where active flyovers are occurring. There will be opportunities for boats to transit these areas several times a day, during the breaks (about every 2 1/2 hours) when the helicopter returns to the airfield to refuel. The Atlantic Intracoastal Waterway will not be affected.

**Here's how to find out where and when DGM flyovers will occur:**

- U.S. Coast Guard Fifth District's Local Notice to Mariners and Broadcast Notice to Mariners, updated each Tuesday and available online at <http://www.uscg.mil/d5/waterways/default.asp>
- Contact the Bogue Sound Adventures, which will be onsite daily during the investigation period, on Marine Channel 16 VHF-FM (156.8 MHz)
- Call 1-877-827-1266 (toll free) for details of daily flyover operations.

**Why:** Former Bomb Target BT-2, also known as Wood Island, is located in Bogue Sound, about 1/2 mile north of the 24th Street area of Emerald Isle. Marine Corps Air Station (MCAS) Cherry Point is investigating potential impacts of aerial bombing training conducted there in the 1940s-1950s.

Scientific instruments called magnetometers, mounted to booms on the helicopter, will be used to locate and create a digital map of metallic objects submerged under water or buried under the ground surface. The resulting data will be used to select specific areas for further evaluation.

Information from the investigation of Former Bomb Target BT-2 will help determine the most appropriate actions needed to ensure safety and to protect human health and the environment.

**Important Safety Message:**  
Old munitions can still be dangerous. For your own safety, please do NOT anchor near Wood Island or go onto the island at any time! If you find munitions in other locations, call your local law enforcement.
