Dear Mr. Jackson:

I have reviewed the above subject document and find it acceptable for its intended use. However, before I am able to agree with your recommendation that a Feasibility Study (FS) is not warranted for this site, further discussions regarding the frequency and magnitude of the constituents detected in surficial groundwater and surface soil need to take place amongst the MCAS Partnering Team. The EPA agrees and acknowledges that a number of data gaps were addressed in this final document which characterized the nature and extent of contamination in the various media. While the contamination appears to be fairly localized and of limited extent, contamination in soil and groundwater exceeds regulatory standards or screening criteria at multiple locations.

Additionally, because investigation activities were conducted at site 35a (High Power Engine Run Up Area and Test Cells) concurrently

with the activities of Site 12, EPA remains interested in your responses to the State of North Carolina's comments on OU6, Site 35a.
